


Our Mission: To cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma and to improve the quality of life of patients and their families.

Since its founding in 1949, The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS) has invested more than \$1 billion in blood cancer research, nearly \$50 million in FY16. LLS-funded research has led to key advances in understanding cancers and has helped produce new treatments to enhance and prolong lives. In addition to key research developments, LLS also offers a variety of educational programs and patient services in support of our mission.

How Funds Are Spent*:



LLS's Light The Night funds lifesaving research and support for people battling cancer. Friends, families, and co-workers form fundraising teams and millions of consumers help by donating at retail outlets. These efforts culminate in inspirational, memorable evening Walks in more than 200 communities each fall across North America.

Each October, The National Capital Area Chapter of LLS hosts three Light The Night Walks in:

Washington, D.C., Rockville, MD, and Reston, VA.

- Nationally, Light The Night raised \$61 million in FY16 alone.
- In the National Capital Area, more than 12,000 walkers, 24 corporate sponsors, and various retail partners raised more than \$3.1 million.
- In the National Capital Area, the Light The Night campaign is projecting that **91%** of funds raised in 2016 will go straight to LLS's mission.
